### 6 Glencoe 2021 MJ-HMP Jurisdictional Annual Report

#### **Primary Point of Contact**

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#### Annual Reporting Year: 2021

**Background**: Cook County and participating municipalities in the county developed a hazard mitigation plan to reduce risk from all hazards by identifying resources, information, and strategies for risk reduction. The federal Disaster Mitigation Act of 2000 requires state and local governments to develop hazard mitigation plans as a condition for federal disaster grant assistance. To prepare the plan, the participating partners organized resources, assessed risks from natural hazards within the county, developed planning goals and objectives, reviewed mitigation alternatives, and developed an action plan to address probable impacts from natural hazards. By completing this process, these jurisdictions maintained compliance with the Disaster Mitigation Act, achieving eligibility for mitigation grant funding opportunities afforded under the Robert T. Stafford Act.

**Purpose**: The purpose of this report is to provide an annual update on the implementation of the action plan identified in the Cook County Multi-Jurisdictional Hazard Mitigation Plan. The objective is to ensure that there is a continuing and responsive planning process that will keep the Hazard Mitigation Plan dynamic and responsive to the needs and capabilities of the partner jurisdictions. This report discusses the following:

#### **Hazard Analysis**

Flood: We have experienced flooding at Hazel Ave, the underpass, Skokie Heights, and parts of Sheridan Road.

Extreme Heat: Elderly residents and patrons at Glencoe Beach are vulnerable to extreme heat.

Extreme Cold: Similar to extreme heat, elderly residents are vulnerable to extreme cold.

Wind/Tornado: While no tornados have touched down, severe wind events have impacted the area.

Mitigation Success Stories: Examples of mitigation success stories include, but are not limited to: received a Grant, completed a major mitigation project, etc.

In 2021, cameras were installed in the Village of Glencoe's historic commuter train station. The train station has been an unattended facility since ticketing agent service was discontinued a few years ago. Adding video cameras provides the Public Safety Department with the ability to monitor the station remotely. Cameras have helped deter some vandalism and identify perpetrators of vandalism that did occur. Cameras also help monitor for fires and other hazards.

Future Needs: Examples of future needs include, but are not limited to: receiving training to better understand the mitigation grant application process, studies that may be needed to better understand hazards/risks, etc.
